What is HPRP?

HPRP is a new program that offers help for people with temporary financial difficulties. If you've fallen on some hard times, the County of Los Angeles wants to help you stay in your home or find a good, safe place to live.

Are you losing your home or have nowhere to live?

HPRP can help you pay for costs such as:

- Back rent
- Rental assistance
- Past-due gas and electric bills
- Security deposit for a new apartment
- Fees to turn on your utilities

The program may also offer:

- A short-term rental subsidy
- Mediation services
- Consumer counseling
- Legal services

HPRP (The Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-housing Program) is not designed to help the chronically homeless. For services to help the chronically homeless call 211, L.A. County's information hotline.

Who qualifies?

This program is designed to help individuals, couples, and families who:

- Have a low income (income restrictions based on family size)
- Are in danger of losing the place they are renting or have recently lost their place to live
- Live in the unincorporated area of Los Angeles County or one of the participating cities
